WEF 2025: CtrlS to invest Rs 10,000 crore in AI Datacentre cluster in Hyd



Hyderabad: Asia's leading data centre provider CtrlS Datacenters Limited will invest Rs 10,000 crore to set up an Artificial Intelligence (AI) datacentre cluster in Hyderabad. The company signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Telangana government in this regard during the ongoing World Economic Forum (WEF) in Davos, Switzerland. According to the Chief Minister's Office, the data centre cluster will come up with a capacity of 400 MW. The facility is expected to generate direct and indirect employment for 3,600 people and contribute significantly to the state's economy through incremental tax revenues. This agreement demonstrates Telangana's commitment to fostering innovation, driving investments, and positioning the state as a leading digital infrastructure hub, it said. "This collaboration with CtrlS is a significant milestone in our journey to establish Telangana as a global leader in digital infrastructure and technology. The AI centre cluster will not only enhance the state's IT capabilities but also create substantial employment opportunities, contributing to our vision of inclusive growth," said Minister for Information Technology and Industry D. Sridhar Babu. Jayesh Ranjan, Special Chief Secretary, Information and Commerce and IT Departments, said the partnership highlights Telangana's proactive approach to supporting large-scale investments in the IT sector.

IT Department searches in Tollywood continue for second day



Hyderabad: The Income Tax Department continued searches at the properties of prominent film-maker and Telangana State Film Development Corporation (TSFDC) Chairman Dil Raju, Mythri Movie Makers and Mango Media in Hyderabad for the second day on Wednesday. Online movie streaming services The searches, which began Tuesday morning, continued at various locations including Dil Raju's residence in Ujas Villas, Jubilee Hills, his office and the premises of his relatives on Wednesday. Several teams of IT officials were checking the financial transactions of the production houses, which made some of the major big-budget movies recently. The searches are said to be part of investigations into the difference between their revenues and Income Tax paid. The IT sleuths were inspecting key documents including balance sheets and IT returns. They were also checking bank lockers as part of the investigation. Dil Raju's wife was taken to a bank on Tuesday and lockers were opened in her presence. Dil Raju, whose real name is V. Venkata Ramana, recently produced movies like 'Game Changer' and 'Sankranthiki Vasthunam' under the banner of Sri Venkateswara Creations.

Telangana Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy said on Wednesday that urban mobility is a major focus area for the state government which plans to expand Hyderabad Metro Rail, build a new Regional Ring Road and Ring Rail.

Addressing the roundtable on urban mobility at the WEF CII conference in Davos, he mentioned its four aspects - infrastructure, accessibility, inclusivity and sustainability. The Chief Minister invited solutions to move more than 40 million people across Telangana, in the fastest time, in the greenest way, at the lowest cost.

"If you want to predict the future of any city over the next 10, 20, 30 or 50 years, calculate the

time and cost of moving one person, or one object for a distance. Cities where costs and time to move people and goods are low, will win in the long term and have a great future," he said.

Asserting that urban mobility is the foundation for cities' growth and future, he said, "The growth of nations depends on the growth of cities. So urban mobility will, along with sustainability and environmental factors, decide the future of mankind."

Sharing his experience in Switzerland, he took a train from Zurich to Davos and it was a beautiful trip.

"My challenges back home are slightly more complicated. My capital city Hyderabad has a population of over 12 million. And growing fast. For me, urban mo-

bility is to connect people inside my City, but also connect my city to towns and villages across the state," CM Reddy said.

The Chief Minister mentioned that his government is building new lines for Hyderabad Metro, to over 100 km, more than double the existing capacity. Hyderabad has a 160-km-long Outer Ring Road.

"Now I am building a Regional Ring Road, of nearly 360 km to connect all my major towns and villages. I am also planning to build a Regional Ring Railway, around the Ring Road. Thus, our people will have 2 circles of roads and 2 circles of railway. We will also have Radial Roads connecting these Rings," he said.

Asserting that Telangana is a land-locked state, he said the state

government was building a major dry port to become a supply chain and warehousing hub.

"We are also connecting this dry port to their closet port, called Machilipatnam port, with a dedicated Highway and a dedicated Railway link," he said.

The Chief Minister also revealed that the state government is replacing 3,000 public buses running on petrol and diesel with electric buses. Claiming that electric vehicles are a big focus for his government, he said it removed all road tax and registration charges on all EVs. Telangana has highest growth of sales in EV in entire India.

"We are also building a new Future City, a net zero city. We want to have the world's best mobility options in this city," he added.

Govt Welfare Schemes to Reach Every Eligible Beneficiary: Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy

State Minister for Irrigation and Civil Supplies, Uttam Kumar Reddy, announced that the government is committed to ensuring welfare schemes reach every eligible beneficiary. Speaking at a Gram Sabha in Rudrangi Mandal, he emphasized the issuance of ration cards, Indiramma houses, Rythu Bharosa, and Indiramma Atmiya Bharosa schemes, guaranteeing no one is left out.

He stated that 6 kg of fine rice would be provided to ration cardholders, and landless laborers will receive ₹12,000 annually. House construction

aid of ₹5 lakh (₹6 lakh for SC/ST beneficiaries) and ₹12,000 per acre under Rythu Bharosa will be extended to eligible beneficiaries.

Minister Ponnam Prabhakar urged opposition leaders to contribute positively during Gram Sabhas, while Government Whip Aadi Srinivas highlighted local development efforts.

District Collector Sandeep Kumar Jha noted that 3,407 beneficiaries were identified, and applications from unlisted individuals will be reviewed.

The ministers also inspected the Kalikota Suramma Project and urged for its speedy completion. Key officials and leaders participated in the event.

"Before Elections, Free Rice; After Elections, Empty Promises: Harish Rao Slams Government"

Former Minister and Siddipet MLA Harish Rao criticized the government's failure to fulfill its promises, particularly regarding ration cards and loan waivers. Speaking at a public meeting in Gadicharlapalli, 15th ward of Siddipet, he expressed dissatisfaction with the continuous difficulties citizens face while applying for government schemes. Rao highlighted that despite repeated applications—through the "Mee Seva" platform and village meetings—the



government's failure to process these applications online had led to unnecessary delays. "People are spending money repeatedly, applying for the same things again and again," he said.

He also condemned the government's inability to deliver on any promises made in the past 13 months. "Before the elections, they promised free rice to everyone, but after the elections, they are offering empty promises," he added.

Rao criticized the Chief Minister for claiming loan waivers were completed, challenging him to prove how many farmers received these waivers. "This government doesn't care about farmers; it was built on lies and deceit," he stated.

He demanded the government issue a white

paper on loan waivers, detailing how many farmers benefited. Rao further criticized the government's priority for projects like the Outer Ring Road and the beautification of Musi, questioning why there is no money for farmers but funds for infrastructure development in select areas.

Rao also called for the government to ensure ration cards are issued to all eligible beneficiaries, stating that this is the only way to truly support the people.

The event was attended by village officials and local leaders.

Kavitha Criticizes Congress Over Failure to Fulfill Welfare Promises and Development Goals

Jalgaon: 8-10 passengers die as they jump from train amid fire rumour, hit by another train

Chaos erupted at Paranda railway station in Maharashtra's Jalgaon district following rumours of a fire on the Pushpak Express. In a desperate bid to save their lives, passengers began jumping off the train, only to be struck by the Karnataka Express travelling on an adjacent railway track, resulting in the death of at least 8-10

people. The incident occurred around 5 p.m. Pushpak Express, en route from Lucknow to Mumbai, had come to a halt after passengers pulled the emergency chain. At the same time, the Karnataka Express, travelling from Manmad to Bhusawal, was approaching on the parallel track.

Eyewitnesses say that the commotion started when sparks appeared from the

wheels of the Pushpak Express as it halted near Paranda station. A rumour of a fire quickly spread among passengers, leading to panic. Some passengers leapt from the train and came into the path of the Karnataka Express.

Preliminary reports indicate that 8 to 10 people lost their lives, while 30 to 40 others sustained injuries in the tragic incident.

Jalgaon SP confirmed the fatalities and injuries, stating, "Several passengers jumped off the train after rumours of a fire. Unfortunately, they were hit by the Karnataka Express coming from the opposite direction."

Railway authorities, including the Divisional Railway Manager of Bhusawal, along with medical teams and local administration, have reached

the site to oversee rescue and relief efforts. Senior railway officials and state government teams are coordinating the response to ensure medical attention for the injured and to investigate the incident.

A Railway Ministry official said that some passengers got off the Pushpak Express after performing ACP (Alarm Chain Pulling) and came under the Karnataka Express.

Study Committee on Farmer Suicides to Visit Adilabad

Submit Applications If Names Are Missing in Welfare Scheme Lists: Collector Venkatesh Dothre

He confirmed that the Rythu Bharosa scheme would apply only to farmers with agricultural land, and non-agricultural plots such as rocky terrains, hills, colonies, ventures, and

acquired lands would be removed from the list.

For ration cards, he encouraged all eligible individuals to apply if their names are missing from the list. Under the Indiramma Atmiya Bharosa scheme, landless agricultural laborers and those who have worked for at least 20 days under the National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (NREGS) will be eligible. Similarly, eligible individuals not listed for Indiramma Housing can submit applications to ensure they receive the scheme's benefits. The Collector assured that steps would be taken to deliver welfare schemes to every eligible beneficiary without fail. This program was attended by relevant officials and other stakeholders.
